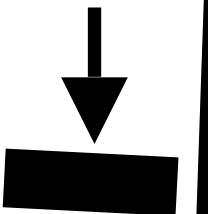

Bus services 28 and 12 to West Hunsbury both under threat - *"This is outrageous"* says Jill Hope

## Call to Action

We warned you in the last FOCUS leaflet that the number 28 bus was under threat. Now it's been confirmed, and it's even worse than we thought.

According to The Chronicle and Echo on 27 January, not only the number 28 bus is under threat from cuts by the conservative-led County Council, but so is the number 12 service from Camp Hill.

This is outrageous. Clearly a lot of people in West Hunsbury have a car, or even two cars. The bus usage is low. But for those people who rely on the bus to take them shopping, to get to work, to get to

Northampton, this is devastating news.

Even if you don't use the bus currently, you may need to in future:

- What if you're getting older and eventually can't drive any longer?
- What about when your children get older and want to get about without relying on you for lifts all the time?
- What if your husband has to use the car for work and you can't afford a second car, but need to get to work yourself?
- What was the point of building a new estate of affordable houses in West Hunsbury, the West Lake Estate, if you then withdraw the bus service?

I call on the people of West Hunsbury to rise up and protest about this. Write, write, write -

### Number of people out of work in Northampton is falling

Unemployment in Northampton is continuing to drop at a steady rate.

The latest monthly figures for November show the number of Jobs Seekers Allowance claimants at 5,036, which is only 3.75% of the working population.

Compared with a year ago, vacancies are up by 45%. The biggest number of vacancies are in logistics,

warehousing and HGV drivers, and the most sought after occupations are office based and retail.

Northampton compares well with the rest of the East Midlands region and with the rest of the county.

In terms of change, only South Northants and Daventry councils perform better, and they already have very low unemployment.

### connexions NORTHAMPTONSHIRE Connexions cuts will hurt young people.

Just at a time when young people are finding it particularly hard to get work, it is sad to see the Connexions service facing cuts of a third in their budget by the Conservative-led County Council.

Connexions work with NEETs - young people who are not in employment, education or training.

Local campaigner Jill Hope commented: *"I worked for Connexions for a year not long ago, and I was really impressed with the important work they did with young people. I am alarmed that their budget has been cut just at a time when the work they do is needed more than ever."*

### THE SAINTS - THE TRUTH ABOUT THOSE PLANNING ISSUES

Jill Hope said: *"Talking to local residents, I frequently come across people who support our local rugby team."*

*"They have said to me that the Lib Dems don't want to help our club!"*

**Lib Dems are cutting over £5 million out of the Councils budget this year, and they are doing it without cutting services!**

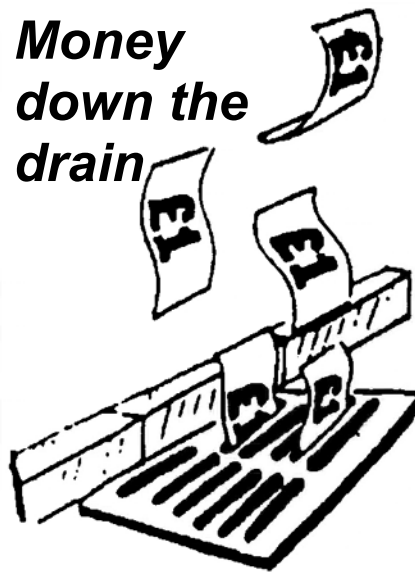
**Council Tax is frozen**- helping hard pressed taxpayers.

**£2 Million on

**Conservative County Council bosses want to sack lollipop people, close libraries and cut care for the elderly and infirm, but then they are planning to spend £2 million on setting up a new Quango.**

The 'Northamptonshire Economic Partnership' quango will duplicate the work of the West Northants Development Corporation (WNDC) which is about to be disbanded and its work handed over to local councils like Northampton Borough.

Leader of the Lib Dem opposition on the County Council, Brendan Glynane said: *"It is scandalous that the Conservatives want to spend £2 million on this, when frontline services to the most needy people are being cut. The last thing we need in these difficult times is another expensive quango."*

#### Europe improves your rights to hospital treatment

MEPs have passed new European rules allowing people to receive medical treatment in other EU Member States.

They mean that if a patient from Northampton is unable to gain access to essential medical care within a reasonable time,

they would be allowed to have their treatment in another Member State, fully paid for or with the ability to claim back the money spent.

Bill Newton-Dunn, your Lib Dem MEP commented: **"The new rules provide a coherent and clear legislative framework for UK patients seeking treatment in another EU Member State and are**

**a real milestone for cross-border healthcare in Europe. I think we have found the right balance between protecting national health systems and strengthening patients' rights."**
