

Brown bin collections are back!

BETTER service costing less. That's what your Lib Dem Borough council has achieved.

BECAUSE of Government cuts, the council had to find a way to collect waste and recycling, and to keep the town clean, more cheaply than ever before. It has taken two years of hard work, but a deal has been done.

EARLY this summer, a private company will be taking over this work, and they will be improving the service while costing less than the council's own service. Jobs will not be lost, as the existing council staff will be transferred over to the new company.

BEST of all, as part of the new service, fortnightly brown bin collections will be restored in West Hunsbury, something that many keen gardeners will welcome, especially coming as it does just as gardening activity increases with the warmer weather.

Great news for Hunsbury Hill Park and Shelfleys Park

LAST year it was very disappointing when the application to the Playbuilder fund to pay for new play equipment in Hunsbury Hill Park failed. Even more so, when it was announced that the Playbuilder fund had ended.

NOW, some great news funding for play equipment has been agreed. Both Hunsbury Hill Park and Shelfleys Park will see new equipment this year.

£30,000 has been allocated to Hunsbury Hill Park by the Lib Dem Borough Council, after years of campaigning by the Friends of Hunsbury Hill Park.

ALSO, the money allocated by the developers



of the West Lake estate will be used to improve the play equipment in Shelfleys Park.

CHILDREN, parents and grandparents will be delighted, particularly at a time of council cuts.

Fortunately the Lib Dem Borough Council has worked hard to save money over the last 4 years, so they can afford this work without cuts to frontline services or mass redundancies.

Bus campaign

THE Conservative County Council has now passed its budget, removing most of the money it used in the past to subsidise bus routes.



THE NEW budget starts on 1 April, but the deal with the bus companies

is on 3 months' notice, so nothing will happen immediately.

IF NO BUS company is prepared to run the No. 28 commercially, the service will be lost unless the Council decides to use some of the money allocated for different public transport options across the county.

IN CASE we need this money, please write to Councillor Jim Harker and Councillor Heather Smith, at Northants County Council, County Hall, Northampton NN1 1ED. These two will be responsible for this decision. If we can persuade them that we really need the number 28 bus, they might allocate this money to West Hunsbury. Update on Park Café


PLANNING permission has been granted on converting the old toilet block in Hunsbury Hill Park into a café
